Remembering Jack

One of the early and most active members of the Over the Hills Gang ATV Club, John Halverson, passed away on September 23, 2024, at the age of 87.

Most of us knew him as Jack, and we will miss his humor, insights, and his riding style (fast). John helped design and construct some of the area's first ATV trails, along with friends Len Hardy, Dick Beam, Jack Lysne, Jim Hilger, Doug Gifford, Brian Erdmann, and others, that later became the Emily Outing ATV Trail.

He attended countless public meetings to advocate for safe, sustainable and connected trails. John was a certified MN DNR Safety Instructor, and in 2023 helped with a Remer High School ATV safety class of over 40 students, managing the ramp obstacle.

He served as a MN DNR Volunteer Trail Ambassador, and a Ride Leader for many OTHG ATV Club events. John was one of the favorite ride leaders, taking people down trails / logging roads / water holes and whatever he thought was fun.

One of his most favorite spots, he called the Honda carwash. Many riders would comment "It's tough to keep up with that guy".

John stayed active in the club, giving advice to current trail coordinators just one week before his death. John was a

Join us on Saturday, December 14 from 11am to 4pm for Getting Loose on the Moose!


Again this year we will have a "Bonfire crawl" winter ATV ride on the Moose River Trail.

Trail Updates









Northwoods Happenings

The Northwoods Regional ATV Trail Alliance (NRATA) held their quarterly meeting on October 9, 2024 at the Village Inn in Outing. The OTHG Club is a member of this current 8 club alliance that manages over 500 miles of a connected trail system in north central Minnesota. The next meeting is January 15, 2025 in Aitkin. Here are some of the key items discussed.

- The development of an electronic map that would include all 11 trail segments on one map to be available using Avenza.
- Eagle Country Snowmobile & ATV Club, based out of Remer, will be hosing the 2025 ATV Minnesota Ride & Roast on Saturday May 17, 2025. See ATVMN.org for details
- A second Northwoods grant of \$250,000 has been approved for use in 2025 to repair segments of the NRATA System. The

Northwoods Trail System is poorly marketed. It is the largest connected trail system in Minnesota, and in the upper midwest. The trail allows a rider to ride into Wisconsin and Michigan. Each year Trail Counters continue to show an increase of riders on this trail system providing much needed income to rural communities. Look for a plan to hold a NRATA open house with tourism and legislative officials in the near future

- OTHG has asked for \$25,000 of this grant to use on the southern part of the Cedar and Wren loops of the Moose River ATV Trails
- The Range Riders ATV Club out of Grand Rapids, who hosed the MN Ride & Rally, and manages the UPM Blandin Trail, attended this meeting and is considering joining the alliance. THE UPM Blandin is part of the Northwoods Trail System and a beautiful 21 mile trail connecting from the Rabey line trail north to Pokegama Lake. Zorbaz is a great tider destination on the north end.



New Trail Additions

Little Bear has made his way out to the "A" trail somewhere north of Sunset Hill Road. Little Bear is a chainsaw carving donated to our club by chainsaw artist Brian Worth. If you get a chance to ride the Prospector Loop Trails in the Ely area, watch out for more carvings by Worth.

Steel Bridge:

The steel bridge is located just north of Heartland Sports and Storage on our "A" trail in the MN Hwy 6 right of way. The club replaced the old Hilger bridge that spans a small creek feeding South Roosevelt Lake. The original wooden bridge was rebuilt twice by the club, once in 2012, and again in 2016. It was again sagging from the increasing ATV traffic and heavier class 2 ATV's. The new steel bridge is 9 feet wide and rated for 5 tons. This allows our Trail Coordinators to cross over the bridge with skid steers and tractors while performing trail maintenance.



Grant Manager Report

The OTHG has asked for \$25,000 of the \$250,000 Northwoods grant to use on the southern part of the Cedar and Wren loops of the Moose River ATV Trail (see Northwoods article above)





One of our missions for our club is to promote ATV Safety, especially for children. Here are a few statistics that highlights this mission

In the US there have been over 4,000 children 15 years of age and under who have been fatally injured in ATV or UTV accidents since 1982.

- In 9 of 10 fatalities, the victim is not wearing a helmet.
- In 95% of fatalities the victim had not received safety certification.
- 92-97% of child ATV / UTV related fatalities, the child is on an adult-sized machine.
- 63% of all fatalities are due to rollovers
- 70% happen in the right of way.

The data concerning injuries is alarming. According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, 40,000 to 55,000 children are visiting Emergency Rooms each year, due to ATV/ UTV related injuries. 27% of these require hospitalization and can involve multisystem injuries including traumatic brain injury (leading cause of fatality), broken bones, internal organ injuries, spinal cord injuries, paralysis, burns, and amputations.

For children under 18, wearing a DOT approved helmet is the law as an ATV operator or passenger.

A MN ATV Safety Certificate is also mandatory for anyone born after July 1, 1987 and is at least 12 year of age to operate an ATV on public trails.
