

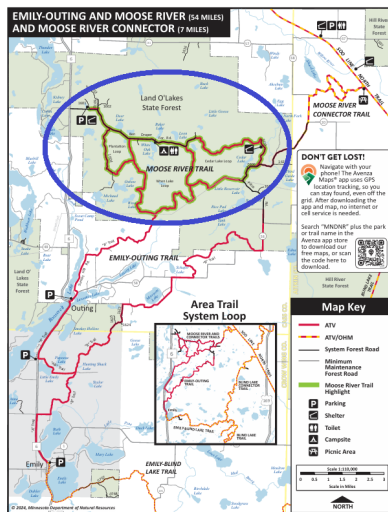

## Winter ATV Riding in MN Trail Updates



Nobody wants the ATV riding season to end. On the Moose River ATV trail system, it doesn't have to! Located 7 miles north of Outing, on Draper Tower Road, 29 miles of rugged Class 1 & 2 ATV trails are available for your year-round riding enjoyment

### Moose River ATV Trails When open

**Closed 11/9 - 11/24 for firearms deer season.**

Normal season:  
Year-round (except firearms deer season)

Winter ATV trails will close on March 15th for the Spring thaw, and open for the Summer riding season according to the date on the DNR website

Recently, the MN DNR opened up a winter season for their Grant In Aid (GIA) program, which allows clubs to draw on grant funds for the maintenance of trails during the winter. For the 2024-2025 winter riding season, the Over The Hills Gang is teaming up with the Ideal Sno Pros snowmobile club out of Ideal, MN to groom the Moose River trails with the goal of keeping them passable by a stock Class 1 ATV.



The Sno Pros will use their tracked UTV, pulling a small Arrowhead groomer to keep the snow pack at a manageable 12".



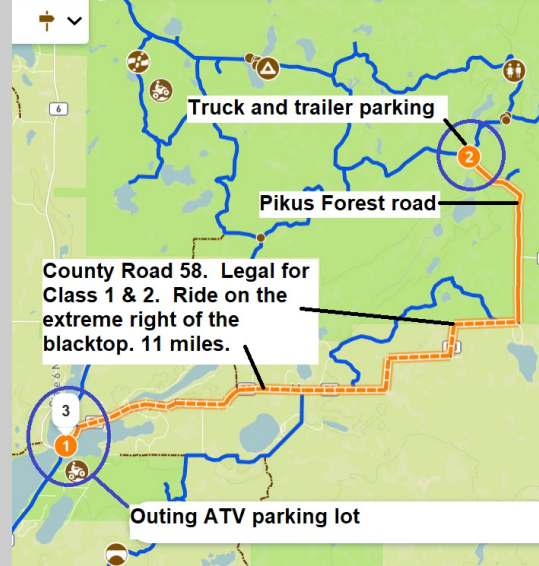
If you've ever attempted to ride through snow deeper than that, you'll know that sometimes it doesn't go so well!



The Plantation and Wren Lake Loops will be one-way signed and groomed, but the Cedar Lake loop will be left untouched for riders who like to test their machine against the full depth of Old Man Winter.



Draper Tower road and the ATV parking lot will be kept plowed for easy access by truck and trailer.  
 You can also park at the intersection of Pikus Forest road and the Cedar Lake Loop.



If you don't mind a bit of road riding, parking in the town of Outing is possible as well, giving you access to gas and food to supercharge your adventure!

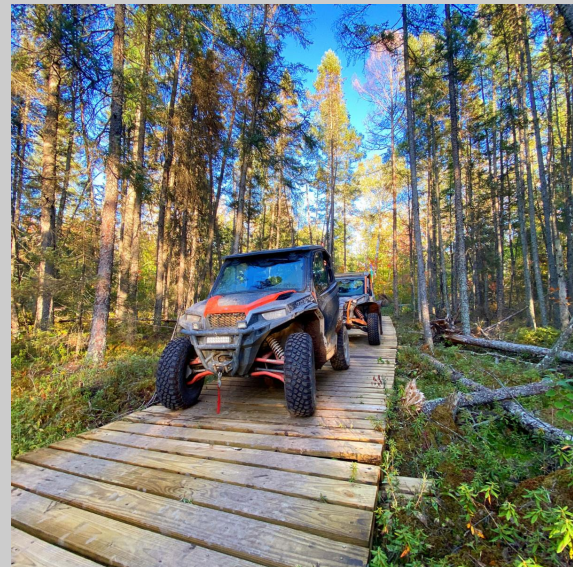

Parking is challenging in the winter so please be patient.

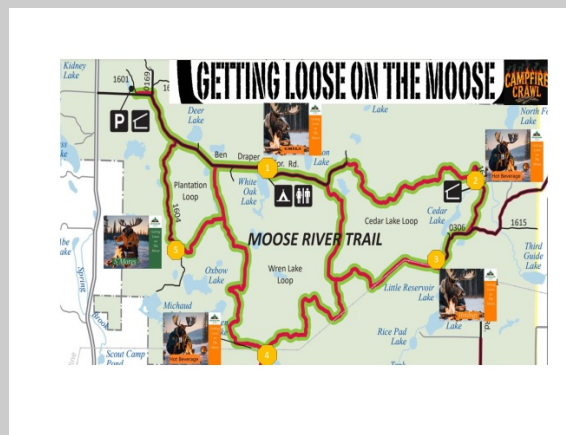
After the ride, join us at the Village Inn in Outing from 4 to 6pm for social hour with food and drink specials and door prizes.

## Trail Updates

---



### Trail Counters

On our Emily/ Blind Lake ATV Trail (EBL) we use a Traf-X Counter to count ATV use on the trail. This provides a reliable number of trail users, which we use to help support our grant maintenance needs and to show a correlation to economic input into our local businesses.

The counter is actually a magnetometer that is programmed to sense an ATV crossing a magnetic plane.

Trail count for the EBL was 19,056, which was slightly down from the 2023 number of 20,066.

The very wet weather in the spring, and the dry weather in late summer and fall may have contributed to this slight downturn. Overall Northwoods ATV trail numbers placed in Aitkin County, not counting EBL numbers were up to 127, 508 compared to 2023 numbers of 117,614.

We do not have counters on all sections of the trail.

Our Emily Outing counter was

vandalized in 2023, so we do not have a count for 2024.

Our club trails remain one of the most popular riding destinations in Minnesota. Thank you to our Trail Coordinators Terry Sewill, Tim Sink, and Kent Korman for contribution to this success.

## Grant Manager Report

Watch for future updates on what we have been working on

A total of 26 ATV fatalities have been recorded in Minnesota in 2024. This is a large increase from 2023 (15) and from 2022 (22). These are preliminary numbers, and final ATV safety statistics will not be released until after January 1. Some additional interesting statistics include:

- 18 of the 26 fatalities were older than 37 (No ATV safety certificate needed if born before July 1, 1987)
- 58% of the fatalities occurred in a Class 2 (side by side style) machine
- 62% (16) of the fatalities occurred on Road Right of Way
- 27% (7) of the fatalities occurred on Private Property
- 11% (3) of the fatalities occurred on Public Trails
- 50% (13) of the fatalities involved alcohol
- 81% (21) No operator/ passenger wearing helmet or seat belt

The OTHG ATV Club holds it's annual Safety Training class in the Spring and we like to stress some key safety habits for keeping you safe on the trails.

- Public Trails are the safest place to ride (They are maintained, signed, mapped with regular monitoring and enforcement)
- Wear a DOT approved helmet- it is the law for operators or passengers under 18 years old

- Wear seatbelts if provided by the Manufacturer- it is the law for operators and passengers under 18 years old
- Get ATV Safety Certified- It is the law for anyone born after July 1, 1987
- Do not operate an ATV while impaired - We need you to be your best when operating your ATV
- Stay informed- Know Regulations, Join a Club, Get Involved
