2024 Safety Statistics Summary

Fatalities: Total - 29 ATV and 1 OHM

Ages:

- · Under age 18 / 2 fatalities
- · 18-36 / 10 /fatalities
- · Over 37 /17 fatalities (*No safety certificate needed if born before July 1, 1987.)

Type:

Rollovers accounted for 14 fatalities

Striking a fixed object accounted for 6 fatalities

Accidents involving another vehicle (car, truck) accounted for 6 fatalities

12 fatalities were Class 1 ATV's and 15 were Class 2 ATV's (side x side)

Location of Fatality:

Road Right of Way -20 fatalities

Private Property - 5 fatalities

Public Trails - 2 fatalities

Other possible contributing Factors:

- · Alcohol/Impairment 13
- · Speed 8
- · No Helmet/Seatbelt -22
- · No ATV Safety Certificate 25

Backed by ATV Safety Statistics in 2024, the safest riders have a MN ATV Safety Certificate, Ride on Public Trails, wear a helmet, wear a seatbelt if equipped, ride without impairment from drugs or alcohol, ride at a safe speed and understand the Minnesota Off-Highway Vehicle Regulations. Adults are always invited to sit in our annual ATV Safety Training Course held on May 3, 2025.(see safety first section)

Trail Rest Stops



The four E's of effective trail management include: Engineering, Education, Enforcement and Evaluation. In this article we are going to focus on Evaluation and more specifically trail rest stops. Our club receives input from riders through emails, Facebook posts, rider conversations

and Trail Ambassador reports. One Trail Ambassador report suggested the addition of more trail rest stops. As we consider this suggestion, we first must recognize the locations we call rest stops today, which could include ATV parking, picnic tables, kiosks, shelters, and /or toilets.

Rest stops could also include stops at our businesses in Outing, Emily, and Fifty Lakes. Our club considers the following areas as trail rest stops when riding the Emily-Outing, Emily-Blind Lake, Moose River, and Blind Moose Loop Trails. Some stops are maintained by the Blind Lake or Northwoods Quads ATV Clubs.

Draper Tower Road Parking Area: Kiosk, picnic table, and Shelter White Oak Lake Campground: ADA Vault Toilet, dispersed camping

Cedar Lake Loop: Shelter, picnic table, portable toilet Cedar Lake Loop / Pikus Forest Rd.: Kiosk, parking

Egg Lake: Dispersed Camping

All Pine Inn: Restrooms, water, shelter, camping, on sale beverages Luscher Park: ADA Toilet, picnic tables, shelter, playground, fishing pier

Little Emily Lake County Park: Shelter, ADA Toilets, picnic tables, playground, fishing pier, swim beach, walking trails

Emily - Bloomquist Dr. & Dr. & Amp; Mn Hwy 6: Parking and Ice Cream / Gift shop next door

Emily City Park: Shelter, ADA Toilet, Playground, Picnic tables

Emily Blind Lake Selfie Station: picnic table, selfie station Emily Blind Lake / Blind Lake Connector: Kiosk, Picnic Table

Blind Lake Connector / Aitkin Cty. Rd.3: Shelter, ADA Toilet, Picnic Table

Swatara Soo Line North: ADA Toilet, picnic table

Moose River Connector / Soo Line North: Shelter, picnic tables, ADA Toilet

We are looking at possibly adding a portable toilet north of Outing between Sunset Hill Road and the Moose River trails, or near Little Reservoir Lake just off the Pikus Forest Road. We are always open to suggestions.
